Assessment of Progress

The ESOL 'Big Tests' measure a student's progress in developing productive and receptive English language skills, from working accurately with single 'English' letters, through working at 'word' level to working with phrases, short sentences and finally to a short paragraph. Big Tests measure reading and understanding, including reading aloud, listening and understanding, speaking and writing of English. Progress is measured against the Manchester Academy Steps.

Big Tests take place in the fortnight before each half term / end of term holiday to enable students' timetables to change in the fortnight after the holiday.

Students are also periodically assessed using bespoke assessments for intervention schemes to ensure each student has an appropriate level of challenge and support.

'Trigger Points' and Transition on Mainstream Timetables

As students develop proficiency in English and progress through the steps, they meet 'trigger points' which prompt movement through the stages of a carefully managed and supported transition into mainstream lessons. Therefore, almost all ESOL students are on part time ESOL/mainstream timetables. New admissions are normally admitted to the department weekly, or as needed.
